The house's symphony orchestra is the Aalborg Symphony Orchestra, which was established during World War II as the Aalborg City Orchestra - and today is an orchestra of international standard. They play for us in the last two sections of the concert.

In the first section, we perform Carmina Burana by Carl Orff with choirs from the Stettin Music Conservatory and from Denmark, three vocal soloists, six percussion musicians and two pianists on two Steinway grand pianos. Czesław Grabowski conducts.

In the second section, the orchestra plays a poignantly unfinished symphony with a dramatic story: composed in 1941 by the Czech composer Pavel Haas, who did not manage to finish it because he was deported to Auschwitz and murdered there. In the third section, we are brought into the Austrian composer Gustav Mahler's fantastic musical world full of beauty, humour, subtlety and with a fourth movement, where the beauty is completed by the Swedish soprano Miah Persson.

The orchestra's American chief conductor Joshua Weilerstein leads the performances.
